

Baltimore City COVID-19 VACCINE FAQ

Information as of April 6, 2021



Beginning **Monday April 12th**, all Baltimore City residents aged 16 years of age and older are eligible for the COVID-19 vaccine. Those with internet access are encouraged to register for an appointment at **covax.baltimorecity.gov**. Once an appointment becomes available, our team will contact you with details of your appointment. If you have previously filled out an interest form with the Baltimore City Health Department, you will not need to “re-register”.



Eligible older adults and those with intellectual or developmental disabilities who lack internet access are able to call the Maryland Access Point (MAP) for assistance in filling out a vaccination appointment.



The Baltimore City MAP can be reached by phone at **410-396-2273**.



Once an appointment becomes available, MAP staff or hospital partners will call residents back with details of their appointment.



They will leave a voicemail, and make multiple attempts to reach you, but may call from an “unknown” number- please pick up!

- M&T Bank Stadium Vaccines:** Call **1-855-634-6829** for assistance in securing an appointment at this site. At this time, having an appointment in advance is mandatory to receive a vaccination.
